

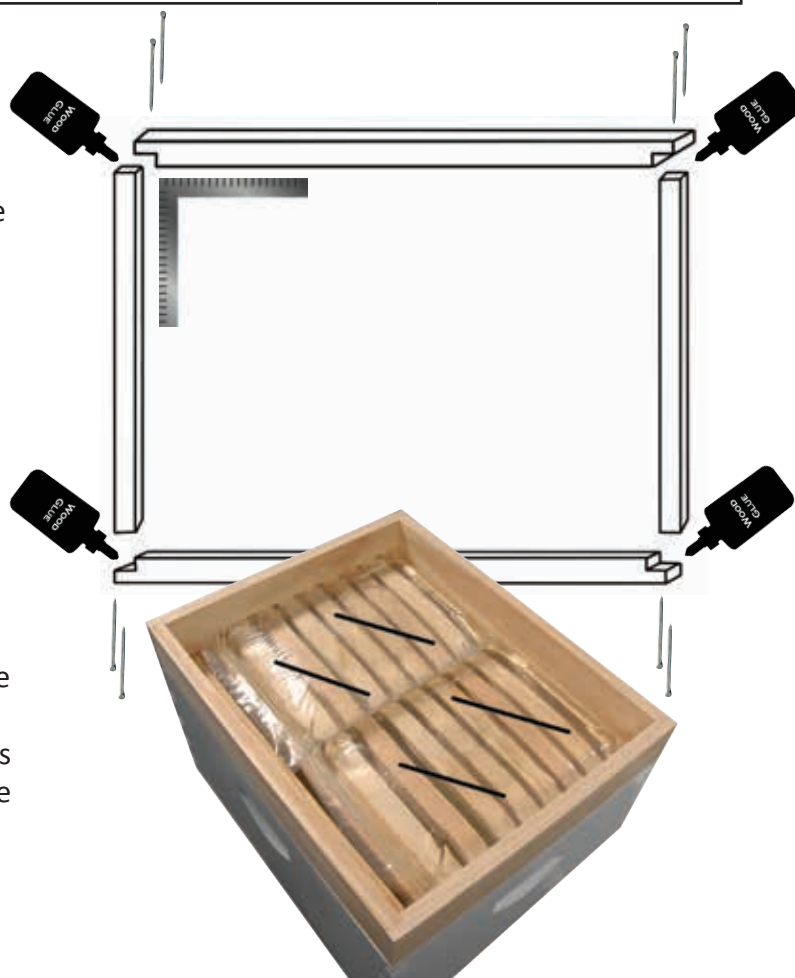
# FD-112 BAGGIE FEEDER ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS

<b>Additional Items Required For Assembly</b>		
Wood Glue <input type="checkbox"/> Hammer <input type="checkbox"/> Construction Square <input type="checkbox"/>		

Apply wood glue to each joint prior to nailing. Use a construction square at the corners to be sure your Baggie Feeder Rim will sit flush on your hive. Paint the outside surfaces if desired.

Remove the inner and telescoping covers and set your Baggie Feeder Rim on top of the upper most brood chamber. Fill your bags 3/4 full of sugar syrup (1:1 sugar to water in the spring, 2:1 sugar to water in the fall).

Push out as much of the air from the bag as possible and seal. Lay 2 bags across the frames and cut small slits in the top surface of the bag with a razor or sharp knife. Let a little of the syrup drizzle down the frames to let the bees know it is there. Replace the bags as the syrup is consumed.



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
